## FIRE & ICE Program

### Program Eligibility Application

**Eligibility Threshold:**

- An eligible student must be enrolled as either an undergraduate or graduate student and be considered full-time at time of application, or completing final credits
  - All students, regardless of major or field of study, are eligible should they meet all program eligibility requirements
  - Students are eligible if they have at least 60 credits with a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of a 3.0 or greater at time of application. Master's degree candidates are eligible if they have a 3.0 cumulative grade point average and have completed 15 credits of their degree program at the time of application.
  - Eligible students must not be on any form of academic probation within the semester that they apply for program assistance nor be immediately coming off probation the semester before applying
  - Funds are made available on a 'first come, first serve' basis
  - Students are eligible to receive more than one designation through the program while enrolled at Thomas but not to exceed \$1,500 in total paid for by HAIBI
  - Students must receive two (2) letters of recommendation from faculty within the field of study/interest that they are seeking designations in. One (1) of these letters must be from their faculty advisor
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***By applying for FIRE & ICE funding, I am agreeing to commit to the completion of the program that I am requesting funding for. Although I am not being required to pass any associated licensing or certification exam at this time for receipt of funding, by accepting FIRE & ICE funding I am pledging in good faith that I will do what is in my power to be prepared to sit for such an exam should I have a future interest in becoming licensed or certified.***
